

About ICMR-NICED

The "Cholera Research Centre" was established in Calcutta by Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR) in 1962 for conducting research on prevention and control of cholera and other diarrheal diseases. Following the outstanding studies on cholera phages, the centre was given the status of "International Reference Centre for Vibrio Phage Typing" by the WHO in 1968 and later on, in 1978, it was designated as the "WHO Collaborative Centre for Reference and Research on Vibrios". With the advancement in research during 1970s, this centre also has expanded its activities and was thus elevated into the status of a "National Institute" and renamed as "National Institute of Cholera and Enteric Diseases" (NICED) in the year 1979. WHO recognized this institute as "WHO Collaborative Centre for Research and Training on Diarrhoeal Diseases" in 1980. During its journey of more than 50 years, the institute has successfully conducted basic research, immunological, epidemiological, clinical and behavioral studies on various infectious diseases especially enteric diseases. Attempt to vaccine, diagnostics as well as drug development has been made for translating the innovation into the development for human use. ICMR-NICED contributes heavily to the national need of capacity building among biomedical professionals and students in fighting the emerging antimicrobial resistance challenge and finding solutions to it. This institute unfailingly contributed to the national needs and will continue to serve the humanity through its scientific endeavors.

Brief Biography of Day's speaker



Dr. Sujit Kumar Bhattacharya, born on January 15, 1950, graduated from University of Calcutta (MBBS) in 1975 and obtained MD degree in General Medicine in 1979. He joined the National Institute of Cholera and Enteric Diseases and finally became Director of the Institute in 1994. He became Additional Director-General of the Indian council of Medical Research, New Delhi in 2006. He then joined the South East Asia Regional office of World Health Organization as Temporary International Professional. He then switched to clinical patient care till date. He was the recipient of Ranbaxy Science Foundation Award for excellence in clinical research. He has to his credit more than 500 publications. He is a fellow of all the prestigious academies in India. His contribution in the field-trial of the Oral Cholera Vaccine in and around Kolkata is well recognized.
